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Slabtown Marketplace gets a well-monied new tenant

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The neighborhood emerging around the former Con-Way properties in Northwest Portland already includes <u>a New Seasons market</u> and, later this year, a new iteration of <u>longtime Portland restaurant Besaw's.</u>

The area will also soon be home to a branch of local credit union, Consolidated Community Credit Union.

CCCU, originally founded in Portland in 1954, will open a new branch in the Slabtown Marketplace building right next to the New Seasons market, which is located at 2170 N.W. Raleigh St. The 1,350-square-foot branch will be the third new or remodeled branch opened by CCCU in the past 15 months. It will open in February.



Consolidated Community Credit Union will open a new branch in the Slabtown Marketplace building in Northwest Portland in February. The new branch will take the place of its existing Northwest Portland one, which is located in the Con-Way administration office.

In August, CCCU reopened its Northeast Portland Branch on Northeast Sandy Boulevard after a complete remodel, and in October 2014 it opened <u>a new branch in the Lloyd District</u> on Northeast Sixth Ave.

CCCU's current Northwest Portland branch, which will be moved into the remodeled Slabtown building space, is located in the Con-Way administration office.

"The new branch is much easer for members to locate and gives us better exposure," said <u>Larry Ellifritz</u>, president and CEO of CCCU, in a release. "It's important to us to be a bigger part of this emerging and expanding neighborhood."

The architect and designer for the new branch is Scott Edwards Architecture. According to information from CCCU, the design is a modern, café style branch with the latest in mobile and digital devices.
